Helping those in need

The need for sustainable housing, water and sanitation solutions remains critical in Vietnam. On average, every year 20,000 people die unnecessarily from contaminated water and poor sanitation. In Vietnam 39 million people – almost double the entire population of Australia – do not have access to a toilet. Less than 50% of all households live in safe housing. Many low income families are homeless; or staying in inadequate housing. Compounding this vulnerability is the fact that 70% of the population is at risk of natural disasters.

Team builds consist in small to large enterprises, HFH teams, faith-based organizations, schools and civic groups. In addition to being an invaluable team-building experience, corporate volunteering effectively breaks down barriers between executives and staff, and encourages better teamwork among or within departments. Other benefits include:

- An engaging and memorable way to carry out corporate social responsibility activities in the communes in which often times one operates
- A rewarding opportunity for staff to experience a sense of personal satisfaction and company pride while also receiving skill development
- A chance to elevate the company's public image at the local or international level

Team builds with Habitat for Humanity Vietnam

Working at HFH Vietnam's construction is the life-transforming endeavor. By working alongside home partners you experience firsthand the powerful impact you make in the lives of families in need of a simple, decent and affordable home. Builds typically last 1 to 2 days. Teams vary in size up to a maximum of 15 volunteers per house, and are made up of anyone who knows how to hold a hammer or a bucket or a paint brush and is in good medical condition

16:45	Clean up of build site and leave for hotel
18:30	Dinner

Note: Itinerary will be adjusted for a particular build depending on project site, and number of volunteers and corporate preferences

Donation package

Meet a HFH Vietnam family

After the accident in 1993, which paralyzed the lower part of his body, Ngo Duc Cho, became confined to a 15 square meter room under a corrugated tin roof, his daily-life centered on his bed. HFH Vietnam worked with him in building a new home. HFH Vietnam also introduced him to the Vietnam Assistance for the Handicapped organization who donated a wheelchair. Cho is now able to move in and around his new home. He shared with us how he experienced change with every brick brought to his new house. His new plan: "My wife and I will stay at the new house and the old place will be used to store our farming equipment and products."
